Our Mission

Brighthouse Scholar Connections, Inc. ("**Scholar Connections**"), a tax-exempt non-profit corporation, was established to expand educational opportunities in higher education for students who are members of historically underrepresented or disadvantaged populations due to race, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, or similar factors ("**Underrepresented Students**").

In order to be eligible for a Scholar Connections Plus Internship, applicants will need to:

- Be a member of a group that historically has been underrepresented or disadvantaged in institutions of higher education due to race, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, or similar factors:
 - Examples of underrepresented and disadvantaged students include, but are not
 - o limited to:
 - o Individuals from racial and ethnic groups which historically have lower college enrollment, retention and completion rates or protracted graduation rates
 - o o Individuals who are the first generation in their family to attend college.
 - o Individuals who have graduated from or are attending a high school that has a low percentage of seniors receiving a high school diploma or a low percentage of graduates who go to college following graduation.
 - o Individuals who have graduated from or are attending a high school with low per capita funding or have lower standardized testing scores according to published data.
- Be enrolled at one of Scholar Connections' partner Educational Institutions on a full-time basis for the 2022-2023 academic year.
- Produce records indicating a minimum grade point average at the Educational Institution of 2.7.

The following documents must be submitted along with this application for consideration:

- Your resumé.
- A writing sample answering one of the writing prompts described below;
- Your current school transcript; and
- A letter of recommendation from a teacher, advisor, guidance counselor or administrator from your current Educational Institution.
